#### **FOCUS & COLLABORATION**



#### **Artists as Teachers**

The arts faculty is composed of professional artists who model the discipline and process required to solve problems in creative ways and promote the collaborative work that is essential in the arts and in the workforce.

#### DIVERSITY

The diverse socio-economic, cultural, and racial mix of students is a unique and special quality of the school. Approximately 50% of students are African American, 40% are white, 5% are Asian, and 3% Hispanic. About 1/4 of our students are eligible for free and reduced lunches.



#### SUPPORT

Students who need it receive free tutoring and test preparation so that they can meet academic benchmarks as well as artistic ones.

The school is located at 712 Cathedral Street in the heart of Baltimore's Mount Vernon Cultural District. Its historic buildings are within walking distance to many of the city's most prominent arts institutions. These organizations serve as a vital resource for students, faculty, and families.

#### ADVANCED STUDY

The academic program includes Honors courses in English, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Spanish, and Calculus. There are AP classes in English Composition, English Literature, Spanish, Music Theory and Art History.
