College Decision Day & Academic Highlights

BSA's students have a plethora of great choices with admissions (and grants and scholarships) to some of the most competitive arts and academic programs at universities across the nation including Harvard, Juilliard, University of Chicago, Princeton, Peabody Institute, Haverford, Eastman School of Music, Brubeck Institute, Indiana University and so many others. Last week saw the induction of 31 juniors to the <u>National Honor Society</u>, scholars who also show excellence in the areas of leadership, service, and character. <u>See the list here</u>. BSA Receives Grant from Saul Zaentz Charitable Foundation to Pilot Film Program

We're delighted to announce the receipt of a grant from the Saul Zaentz Charitable Foundation to pilot an exciting film program for a select group of BSA students and faculty this summer.

A great independent producer, <u>Saul Zaentz</u> specialized in literary film adaptations and won three Best Picture Oscars for *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest/*1975, *Amadeus/*1984, and *The English Patient/*1996, an achievement shared by only a handful of producers. Zaentz believed that film has the power to change our way of seeing the world and the Foundation in his name seeks to continue his legacy.

"This grant will afford our students the time and technology to explore filmmaking on a very deep level. We are looking forward to seeing the work they generate and to adding our kids' voices to the mix in the Saul Zaentz initiatives in Baltimore," said Chris Ford. Johns Hopkins University also recently received funding from the Foundation to establish the Saul Zaentz Innovation Fund in Film & Media.

BSA's program will give voice to the diverse body of its students through the medium of digital media. Students will be introduced to film as a social practice and as a visual medium for storytelling and will create a documentary or a narrative film with the overarching theme of "I Love Baltimore." The 6-week intensive will take place at BSA, primarily in the school's <u>Center for Collaborative Arts & Technology</u>, a state-of-the-art multi-disciplinary lab that houses many of the tools required for filmmaking.

An additional Film/Video Research & Discovery component will consist of a learning experience for the staff and students of BSA. Active filmmakers will visit BSA and BSA film/video faculty will also visit leading high school and college film/video programs around the country. One of the first steps in the Discovery Project will be a meeting with fellow grantees at JHU. The pilot will also enable BSA to explore what a full-time video program might look like for the high school.
