### **THEATRE**

#### Acting

#### **GRADES 5-8**

Explore your imagination in acting classes and work with an ensemble in creative ways. Classes include improvisation, theatre games, and scene study. The 8<sup>th</sup> grade classes also include monologue rehearsal to develop audition material. Classes will be held once a week for one and one-half hours.

Each applicant must be prepared to perform a memorized monologue (one character's speech from a play) no more than two minutes in length or a poem approximately oneminute long.

### THEATRE

#### Stage Design & Production

#### **GRADES 5-8**

Learn a variety of stage design and production skills through puppetry art and literary theatre. Create puppets, scenery, props, costumes, and rehearse and perform your stories. Classes will be held once a week for one and one-half hours.

Previous experience is not required. Each applicant should bring examples of his/her artwork (drawings, paintings, sculpture, collage, etc.). Applicants should be prepared to discuss their artwork. Any experience working on performances, i.e., plays, concerts, dance shows, may be included in the discussion.



### DANCE

**GRADES 2-8** 

Develop your talents in dance. Professional dance educators will train you in the basics of ballet. Classes will be held 1–4 times a week depending upon class level. In the spring, TWIGS dancers participate in an annual production.

Applicants will participate in a brief dance movement class as part of the audition. For the audition, wear a leotard, convertible tights and ballet slippers. Spandex shorts/gym shorts with a close fitting t-shirt may be worn. No skirts, leg warmers, costumes, or jeans. Feet may be bare. Loose-fitting clothing or jewelry should not be worn. Hair should be pulled away from the face and neck and securely pinned back. The audition process typically lasts about two hours.



## MUSIC Vocal

Learn to sing and care for your voice. You will participate in a choral music program to work on components of singing including breath support, posture, note reading, and sound production.

#### **BRING YOUR INSTRUMENT**

We provide a piano and a harp for these auditions and a snare drum for percussion auditions. Bring sheet music and be prepared to play one or two selections and one or two scales on your instrument.

## MUSIC Instrumental GRADES 2-8

Improve on the instrument you now play. On Saturdays you will participate in band, orchestra, or a group class; have a private lesson on your instrument; and take a musicianship class. We offer lessons in all orchestra and band instruments, i.e., string, woodwind, brass, percussion, as well as piano, guitar, and harp.

\*Please note all 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade visual arts classes are one-year programs. Students entering grades 4, 5, and 6 must audition each year to participate.

1:30 p.m. Students entering grades 6, 7, and 8 with the last names M-Z

Students entering 6th, 7th, and 8th grades should choose 12 examples of their artwork they particularly like. This could include drawings, paintings, ceramics, prints, weavings, metal, woodworking, or anything else made by hand in school or at home. Applicants should be prepared to discuss their artwork. They will also complete a drawing exercise during the audition. Materials will be provided. The audition may last up to two hours.

# FILM & VISUAL STORYTELLING

**GRADE 7 AND 8** 

## Visual Storytelling Audition Saturday, May 9, 2020

Film and Visual Storytelling Adobe Suite for Filmmakers

9 a.m. Students entering grades 7 and 8 in September 2020 can audition.

This course is structured around three important Adobe Creative Suite software programs for filmmakers: Photoshop, Premiere Pro, and After Effects. Students will learn the skills necessary to create film posters and short videos with basic visual effects and title sequences. Shots and basic camera work will be explored. Classes will meet once a week after school.

During the audition, students will create a collage and be asked to take a picture of a still life. Materials will be supplied. Students should be prepared to discuss the work created.

11 a.m. Students entering grade 8 in September 2020 can audition.

Film and Visual Storytelling Audition Prep (8th graders can apply to both courses)

This 8-week course is designed to prepare students for the Film and Visual Storytelling high school audition. We will explore the principles of storytelling, how to develop a character, storyboards, and still image compositions. Writing exercises are essential to this class. Classes will meet once a week from October to December.

Each applicant must write a story based on a photograph they will receive as part of their application online. The applicant must bring the story to the audition. At the audition, applicants should be prepared to create an additional story and discuss their work.

# AUDITION INSTRUCTIONS:

Pre-registration is recommended.

Auditions are required for acceptance into the TWIGS program. Any interested student who meets the grade-level requirement\* in September 2020 and who lives in Baltimore City may audition. Classes are held at the Baltimore School for the Arts, 712 Cathedral Street (corner of Cathedral and Madison Streets).

Auditions are required for all classes. Auditions will be held Monday, May 4 through Saturday, May 9, 2020. Carefully check the schedule under each department description for the day and time.

Students may audition for up to two departments BUT, if accepted, MAY ONLY PARTICIPATE IN ONE.

Parents are not permitted to observe auditions. They are not required to stay in the building, but are invited to wait in the designated area until the student's audition is completed. Families will be notified of the results of the audition by email in approximately six to eight weeks.
