



Audio II for Filmmakers

The Charles C. Baum Film and Visual Storytelling Department is looking for an instructor to teach a high school junior class with approximately 15 students once a week on a part-time basis. The candidate needs to have working knowledge and experience of ProTools, Adobe Audition, ADR, Foley, Sound Design, Audio-mixing, and usage of audio recording equipment.

Previous teaching experience is not necessary, however, a passion for working with young people is a must.

The class runs a full school year from August to June, totaling 34 weeks. A class curriculum is provided. Semester (17 weeks) teaching is available as well.

Responsibilities include:

- Teaching an established curriculum
- Maintaining attendance records
- Submission of Grades / Reports
- Attending two faculty meetings per year (one per semester)
- Participate in Auditions and Juries (one per semester)
- Two Parent Art Conferences (one per semester)
