

Honors Experimental Filmmaking Instructor

The Charles C. Baum Film and Visual Storytelling Department is looking for an instructor to teach a high school senior class with approximately 14 students once a week on a part-time basis. The candidate must have experience in shooting and processing analog film working with a Bolex and Super8mm format. Previous teaching experience is not necessary, however, a passion for working with young people is a must.

The class runs a full school year from August 2025 to June 2026, totaling 34 weeks.

Responsibilities include:

- Teaching an established curriculum
- Maintaining attendance records
- Submission of Grades / Reports
- Attending two faculty meetings per year (one per semester)

Requirements & skills:

- BFA or BA
- Working knowledge of analog film production (16mm and Super8mm), Adobe Premiere Pro and Photoshop
- Well versed in the history, theory, and practice of experimental film
- Strong communication skills
- Good attitude and friendly disposition
- Punctual and responsible
