The Program Manager should be familiar with the film industry and possess an eye for detail, excellent communication skills, and strong organizational abilities. Working knowledge of G Suite, spreadsheets (excel and Google), and Adobe Creative Cloud (Photoshop, Premiere Pro) is required.

Responsibilities include among others:

- Faculty communication
- Data input and calendar management
- Organizing and managing auditions, midyear reviews, juries, and screenings
- Coordinating craft services for productions, auditions, juries, and events
